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
President's Message



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Adjudicators

Voice



Contralto Vicki St. Pierre's voice "invitingly combines clarity of expression and beauty of tone," and is described as "rich with both a darkness and brightness." As a specialist in early music, she has recorded with Sacabuche, The Toronto Consort, Capella Intima, and The Viadana Collective (among others). Vicki has performed internationally with such groups as the Academy of Ancient Music, Tafelmusik, Les Violons du Roy, Portland Baroque Orchestra, Sacabuche, and the Pacific Baroque Orchestra. She has also performed

with Symphony Nova Scotia, the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra, the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra, and the Victoria Symphony Orchestra. She has appeared on the operatic stage with Opera Atelier, Ensemble Masques de Montreal, Toronto Masque Theatre, and Early Music Vancouver, among others. She has directed choirs across Canada and in the UK, and has been an assistant conductor with Opera Atelier. Vicki has a doctorate in vocal performance from the University of Toronto, and works at Mount Allison University where she has taught Diction for Singers, Vocal Pedagogy, Opera Workshop, and Applied Lessons. Vicki is currently serving in the role of Provost and Vice-President Academic and Research (Interim) at Mount Allison.

Piano



Canadian pianist **Cindy Thong** leads a polyvalent career as a pedagogue, researcher and performer. She has performed throughout Canada, in Switzerland, Austria, Germany, Spain and Italy, and has also been a finalist and prizewinner in numerous competitions such as the Concours Hélène-Roberge and Canadian Music Competition. She has also made appearances at the Orford Music Festival, Banff Arts Centre, Gijón International Piano Festival and Euro Music Festival, amongst others.

Alongside her performance and pedagogical activities, Cindy maintains a keen interest in performance psychology and mental skills training. In particular, her dissertation pertained to the neuropsychology of learning and the optimization of practice methods, deconstructing and analyzing models related to enhanced efficiency. She has regularly been invited to lecture and offer workshops on these topics and related subjects at institutions such as the University of British Columbia and York University, and continues to expand this interdisciplinary work in collaboration with other domains, such as research for arts and health interventions.

Cindy holds a Doctor of Musical Arts from the University of Montréal (Canada), where she was also awarded the Prix d'interpretation en piano upon graduation. She also holds a Master of Arts in Music Performance from the Haute École de Musique de Genève (Switzerland), as well as a

Bachelor of Music, Master of Music and Artist Diploma from the University of Montréal. Her primary teachers include Jimmy Brière, the late Dominique Weber, and John Hansen. Cindy is currently on faculty at Acadia University and the Maritime Conservatory of Performing Arts. She is also the Artistic Director of the Acadia Piano Intensive program.

Choral



An award-winning conductor, performer, and teacher, **Dr. Margot Rejskind** has directed choirs and orchestras of all kinds, from beginner to professional, in both Canada and the United States. Known for her adventurous and eclectic programming, ensembles under her direction have been heard on CBC, NPR, and the BBC, and have been finalists and semifinalists in a number of national and international competitions, where they have been praised for their musicality, artistry, and radiant sound.

Dr. Rejskind is in demand as a guest conductor and adjudicator, appearing at conferences, festivals, and workshops throughout North America. She is the founding artistic director of Luminos Ensemble, an ECMA-winning PEI-based professional chamber choir and orchestra; artistic director of Forte Men's Choir, and music director of Island Choral Society; and also maintains a busy private voice and conducting studio. She has previously been a faculty member at the Royal Conservatory of Music (Toronto), and Canada's National Ballet School. She has served on the executives of the PEI Registered Music Teachers' Association, and the Atlantic Canada Chapter of the National Association of Teachers of Singing, and is a proud member of the Board of Directors of Choral Canada. Margot can also be heard as a regular music contributor on CBC PEI's Mainstreet.

Margot is a native of Montreal, where she received formative conducting training under Iwan Edwards and Dr. John Baboukis at McGill University, and earned a degree in Voice Performance (Jazz) from Concordia University. She earned her Masters and Doctoral degrees in Conducting from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, studying with Dr. Chester Alwes, and Donald Schleicher. She lives in Charlottetown, PEI.

Brass



Praised for his "sensitive and passionate" playing (The Guardian), **Dale Sorensen** is a versatile trombonist with extensive experience in classical, popular, and musical theatre genres. An enthusiastic promoter of Canadian music, Dale has premiered more than 25 solo trombone pieces and dozens of chamber works, and recorded an all-Canadian album of music for trombone (available on all streaming services). In addition to his frequent solo recitals, Dale has performed as soloist with the Windsor Symphony (ON), PEI Symphony Orchestra, Nova Sinfonia, and the Acadia University, UPEI, and University of Toronto Wind Ensembles. He is a proud Yamaha Artist and plays Yamaha instruments exclusively.

Dale is a member of the Charlottetown Festival Orchestra, PEI Symphony Orchestra, Maritime Brass Quintet, and a regular guest with Symphony Nova Scotia. Previously he held positions with the Windsor

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Symphony and Hamilton Philharmonic Orchestra, and has freelanced with groups such as the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, Tafelmusik Baroque Orchestra, Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony, Winnipeg Symphony, National Ballet of Canada, and Opera Atelier in a 3-week, 8-city tour of Japan.

A dedicated educator, Dale has taught at five Canadian universities and is currently Assistant Professor of Brass and Chair of the Department of Music at UPEI. He regularly serves as an adjudicator and clinician at music festivals and workshops throughout the Maritimes and Ontario. Dale holds music degrees from UPEI, Northwestern University, and the University of Toronto. His doctoral dissertation and several other educational resources and articles are available on his website: www.islandtrombone.com.

Woodwind



Saxophonist and educator **Nicole Strum** is a multifaceted musician, equally at home performing new works, teaching courses in music theory, directing ensembles, and coaching woodwind players. As a performer, she has been praised for her expressive voice and the intensity of her interpretations; as a studio teacher, her commitment to guiding students to discover their unique musical identity is noted by her colleagues.

Nicole regularly performs in concert, often collaborating with flutist Liesel Deppe, saxophonist Tristan De Borba, or pianist Magdalena von Eccher. She has appeared at Arrayspace in Toronto, Halifax's Open Waters Music Festival, the Lunenburg Academy of Music Performance, as well as at North American Saxophone Alliance's Regional and Biennial conferences, the World Saxophone Congress, on the Mount Allison University Recital Series, and as concerto soloist with the UPEI Wind Symphony.

In 2022 Nicole was Visiting Assistant Professor of Single Reeds and Conducting at Mount Allison University, and held the position of Woodwind Specialist for Halifax Regional Arts in Nova Scotia the year prior. Currently she is on faculty at the University of Prince Edward Island where she teaches music theory, saxophone, and directs the UPEI Wind Symphony. She adjudicates at local and national music festivals, leads workshops and clinics, and coordinates UPEI Summer Studios, a week-long chamber music workshop for advanced young musicians.

Nicole holds a performance diploma from the Bordeaux Conservatory, where she studied with renowned French saxophonist Marie-Bernadette Charrier, and a DMA from the University of North Carolina, Greensboro.

Musical Theatre



Elaine Boulanger is a multi-faceted, dynamic and energetic artist who has worked extensively over the last thirty-five years as a music director, adjudicator, voice and piano instructor, choral conductor, clinician, collaborative pianist and church music liturgist. Her illustrious career began at the age of thirteen where she made her debut as a collaborative pianist to a hundred voice choir in Boston, Mass.

Ms. Boulanger is the owner/operator of "Music from the Heart" in Saint John, NB, a music school where the goal is to make learning music FUN! She has been privileged to see many of her award-winning students continue their studies at institutions like Sheridan College,

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Dalhousie – The Fountain School of Performing Arts and Mount Allison University. In 2023, in both the Developing Artist and Emerging Artist Streams at the National Music Festival, Elaine's students took home First Place in the Musical Theatre division.

As a theatre lover, Elaine is an advocate for performing opportunities for her students. She provides them with annual productions, recitals, concerts, camps, and musicals to nurture their growth as young artists. She encourages, and guides them as they participate in community theatre projects, competitions, school productions and prepares them for university and professional theatre auditions.

A highlight of her career was joining the Island Theatre Festival in Charlottetown, PEI as Musical Director with the company of Anne & Gilbert the Musical. Elaine had the pleasure of spending the summers of 2022 and 2023 working with her son, Zachary, as well as recording a new studio album with the writers - Bob Johnston, Nancy White and Jeff Hochouser to be used when mounting the show worldwide.

In 2022, Elaine started Raise Your Voice – Ladies' Choir which grew to fifty voices in its' first season and has filled performance venues for several concerts over the last two years. They have been filmed by ROGERS TV and broadcast over the Christmas season for audiences to enjoy.

Composition



Rebekah Maxner is an imaginative composer whose piano solos are printed and listed in several conservatories, including Canada's Royal Conservatory of Music, the London College of Music Examinations in the UK and in the National Federation of Music Festival bulletin in the US. Her music is heard in recitals, festivals and exams globally. She completed her music degree at Acadia and is a member of the Nova Scotia Registered Music Teachers' Association. Rebekah is an active member of our Canadian music community, having given workshops for teachers, masterclasses for students, and having adjudicated piano and composition contests. She writes the Piano at Play blog and has an international following. Rebekah maintains an independent piano studio in Hantsport, Nova Scotia, where she lives with her husband and youngest daughter.

Strings



Nadia Francavilla is one of Canada's leading performers and advocates of new contemporary music. The Montreal-born violinist is an accomplished recitalist and outstanding chamber musician who has performed internationally in North America, Europe, and Japan. For over a decade, she performed and recorded with two of Canada's leading string quartets: Quatuor Arthur-LeBlanc and Quatuor Bozzini.

Mrs. Francavilla's driving interest in new music has led her to commission and premiere new works from Canadian and international composers. She particularly enjoys working with young composers,

nurturing their innovative spark.

Since 2009, Mrs. Francavilla is UNB's musician-in-residence where she curates leading-edge concert series which challenge audiences to explore new sounds and musical experiences. She teaches classes on women in music and music in films.

Mrs. Francavilla also teaches violin at mount Allison University, gives masterclasses and is often asked to adjudicate at music festivals around the country.
